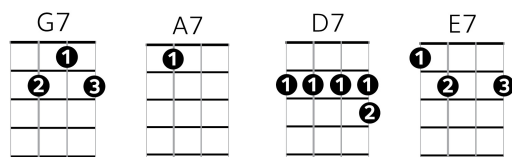


# Hukilau
